The Painted Turtle Camp to Hold Annual Tour de Turtle Bicycle Ride

ake Hughes, Calif. - The Painted Turtle invites community members to participate in the Annual Tour de Turtle Bike Ride on Saturday, October 17, 2015 held at The Painted Turtle camp in Lake Hughes, CA. 100% of every dollar raised by participants will help send children with serious medical conditions to camp. Choose from one of three routes: 18, 36, or 62 miles. Routes are fully staffed with SAG, support vehicles and rest stops. Breakfast will be catered by Marmalade Cafe and lunch by Lemonade Restaurant.

Rider registration is \$25. The fundraising commitment is \$250 for all riders. Participants who raise at least \$1000 are invited to stay the night at camp prior to the race and enjoy dinner and an evening at camp.

A new addition for non-riders this year, is the family-friendly 2 mile Turtle Trek. Pre-registration (\$20) is required and open to all ages.
